### **SUMMARY**

Beginning in 2013 the Cache County Development Services Department was given the task of managing the County Surveyor workload and began making increased efforts to resolve the lack of section corner perpetuation in the county. Prior to 2013 county section corners and tie sheets were neglected and unmaintained to the point that tie sheets had very little to no information (*Image 1: Cache County Tie Sheet # 356*). Due to the lack of perpetuation and documentation the condition or existence of many section corner monuments is unknown. Cache County has contracted Foresight Surveying to assist with perpetuating monuments and to fix/replace monuments as needed.

#### **PROBLEM**

Phase 1- Priority 1A, (*Image 2: Cache County Section Corner Summary*) of the project is near completion (190 of 590 existing section corners remaining). During this phase Foresight Surveyors focused on perpetuating corners that had existing tie sheets and were located on the valley floor in easily accessible and frequently used locations. For Phase 2 - Priority 1B, Foresight Surveyors will focus on corners that have not been located and limited to no data exists. Because the lack of maintenance and perpetuation in the past, the difficulty in accessing some corners, and the fact that many of the incomplete corners are located in roadways requiring excavation/repair/rings & caps, and many have been disturbed or are threatened by landowner activities, the cost is expected to significantly increase. In just December 2015, Foresight Surveyors perpetuated 10 corners and placed 16 new monuments. During 2016 Cache County's primary focus will be finalizing perpetuation in Priority 1A and setting new monumentation in Priority 1B and therefore be required to purchase hardware, such as posts and caps, rings and lids, as well as materials for reference points. Cache County has been and will continue to use hardware (*Image 3: Cache County Section Corner Close Up*) standards set forth in *Field Procedures 1.2.5*.

#### WORKFLOW

Jeff Nielsen P.L.S. of Foresight Surveying completes all the research and field work for new section corners utilizing all existing information (records of survey, historic surveyor notes, etc.) and periodically turns in section corner data to the Development Service Department – GIS Division. The GIS staff is responsible for creating tie sheets (*Image 4: Tie Sheet 573*). Cache County tie sheets meet and will continue to meet tie sheet standards set forth in "*Attachment D*" of the *Public Land Survey System (PLSS) Grant Program*. New tie sheets created with data from Foresight Surveying is merged and documented with old tie sheets as well as area photos, monument close up photos, and notes. Once data is entered into Cache County's Spatial Database, and tie sheets are created, the data is then published to the *Cache County Section Corner & Survey Viewer (http://66.232.67.238/websites/surveyviewer/*).

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#### **GOAL**

- 1. Complete Priority 1A Existing section corners on the valley floor in need of perpetuation
  - a. Perpetuation Completed = 400
  - b. Needs to be Perpetuated = 190
- 2. Priority 1B General area of the valley floor where section corners have not as of yet been located and limited to no data exists. Unknown count of section corners that can be reasonably placed (limitations of data, accessibility and usefulness)
- 3. Priority 2A Existing section corners in the mountainous areas in need of perpetuation
  - a. Perpetuation Completed = 12
  - b. Needs to be Perpetuated = 137
- 4. Priority 2B General area of the mountainous areas where section corners have not as of yet been located and limited to no data exists. Unknown count of section corners that can be reasonably placed (limitations of data, accessibility, and usefulness)

Cache County has already made significant improvements on perpetuation. The challenge going forward will become locating monumentation with little to no information. Through the 2016 year, Cache County will use funds to complete perpetuation of monuments already existing on the valley floor. Once existing monumentation has been perpetuated, the focus will shift to locating corners with limited to no data and/or tie sheet.

#### **BUDGET**

#### Priority 1A: Existing corners needing minimal effort

#### Materials

- 1. 4 Rebar Reference Points \$1.67 each (\$6.68)
- 2. 4 Plastic Caps \$0.26 each (\$1.04)

Total - \$7.72 per corner.

#### Labor

- 1. Survey Monument  $\approx 2$  hours each = \$260.00
- 2. Data compilation  $\approx 1/3$  hour each = \$37.00

Total - \$297.00 per corner.

It is estimated that 91 of the remaining 190 section remaining in Priority 1A can be perpetuated with existing caps and limited labor due to the ease of access. Cache County estimates a cost of \$27,730.

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The initial efforts of the Cache County Section Corner Project have been focused on the section corners that fall within this category. Our efforts will continue to focus on corners in dire need of perpetuation

#### Priority 1A: Existing damaged/missing corners requiring additional repairs

#### Materials

- 1. 4 Rebar Reference Points \$1.67 each (\$6.68)
- 2. 4 plastic caps \$0.26 each (\$1.04)
- 3. Aluminum survey caps \$9.80 each
- 4. Caps, rings, and lids for 71 section corners \$108.00 each (\$7,668.00)

Total - \$17.52 per corner. \$125.52 for each section corner requiring rings & lids in roadway.

#### Labor

- 1. Survey monument  $\approx 3 \frac{1}{2}$  hours each = \$455.00
- 2. Data Compilation  $\approx 1/3$  hour each = \$37.00

Total - \$492 per corner.

It is estimated that 99 of the 190 remaining section corners will require replacement caps and increased labor cost due to difficulty accessing the corner. Cache County estimates a cost of \$58,111.

Labor and material costs will vary. These costs are best guessed estimates derived from GIS data and previous section corner work completed. The total estimated cost is \$85,841.

The initial efforts of the Cache County Section Corner Project have been focused on the section corners that fall within Priority 1A-minimal effort category. Our efforts will continue to focus on corners in dire need of perpetuation with little to no data similar to *Image 1: Cache County Tie Sheet # 356*. Cache County is seeking funds to complete 60 section corners with the initial round of funding. The estimated cost to complete this is \$18,283. (60 Section Corners @  $\approx$  \$297.00 + \$7.72 = \$18,283)

This project is scalable to the amount of funding made available (more section corners can be added with additional funding and/or less corners with less funding).

#### **County Resources/Match**

The County is also putting financial and in kind effort into this project and request. While Cache County is seeking funds to finalize perpertuation of monuments in Priority 1A, the County has allocated funding to 1) pay unique material costs for Priority 1A (asphalt, flowable fill, etc.) and 2) in kind staff time for tie sheet creation and 3) cash match. Additionally, the County will provide crews to cut/patch asphalt and complete traffic control in roadways as needed.

Total county match

- 1. Tie sheet preparation 60 @  $\approx$  3/4 hour each = \$2,250 (in kind)
- 2. Cash contribution \$6,283 + out of pocket expense for unique materials

For this round of funding Cache County is hoping to repair/perpetuate 11 section corners (*See Image 5: Cache County Section Corners to be Maintained*) listed as follows with price quotes from Foresight Surveying;

Southeast corner of section 31 T12N R1W ≈ \$877.67

South  $\frac{1}{4}$  corner of section 31 T12N R1W  $\approx$  \$877.67

East ¼ corner of section 31 T12N R1W ≈ \$877.67

South  $\frac{1}{4}$  corner of section 36 T12N R1W  $\approx$  \$877.67

East ¼ corner of section 6 T11N R1W ≈ \$1157.67

Southeast corner of section 6 T11N R1W ≈\$1157.67

East ¼ corner of section 8 T11N R1W ≈ \$1157.67

South  $\frac{1}{4}$  corner of section 8 T11N R1W  $\approx$  \$1157.67

Southeast corner of section 8 T11N R1W  $\approx$  \$1157.67

Southeast corner of section 17 T11N R1W  $\approx$  \$1157.67

East ¼ corner of section 20 T11N R1W ≈ \$1157.67

The estimated total to complete repairs/perpetuation on these 11 corners is  $\approx$  \$11,614.00

#### **CONCLUSION**

Neglect in the past has created an inventory of section corners that county offices and surveyors have no recent information for. Prior to the beginning of the Cache County Section Corner Project there was no perpetuation of tie sheets and/or corner maintenance. Cache County has made significant improvements to existing section corner data and tie sheets. The *Cache County Section Corner & Survey Viewer* is one of the county's most used tools for surveyors, realtors, title companies, cities, and the general public. As Cache County transitions into a more financially burdensome phase of the project, the requested funding assistance will greatly improve the project's success and completion schedule. Cache County hopes to provide the PLSS with better quality section corner data as well as create an environment to receive higher quality land surveys and avoid property disputes.

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

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


